Biographical Summary

I am a tenure-track assistant professor and director of the *Liberal Studies* program (supervising about 300 students) at the University of Houston, a Carnegie-designated lier One institution. I teach theories of knowledge and truth, and ethics. In the last years I was a visiting professor at the University of Bergamo in Italy (2015, 2022), a lecturer at the University of Vienna (2019) and the Institute Vienna Circle (2015, 2017), and an academic visitor at the University of Oxford (2016, 2017).
