COURSE REQUIREMENTS

Completion of the bachelor degree requires a minimum of 120 credit hours of course work and a minimum of 1,000 total hours of work experience in the hospitality industry (GHL 2160 = 300 internship hours, GHL 4360 = 700 work hours). Students must satisfy at least 36 advanced credit hours and at least 24 of the last 30 semester credit hours in residence. Students wishing to declare a major in Global Hospitality Leadership must earn a minimum cumulative UH GPA of 2.5, submit a completed UH General Petition form declaring this major to the Hilton College Office of Academic Services and sign an official major degree plan. All general education courses must be UH approved.

REQUIREMENTS

- You **MUST** complete the requirements for Internship (300 hours) and Professional Development (700 hours) for a total of 1,000 hours.

INTERNSHIPS

- Your internship **MUST** either be approved or obtained through the internship coordinator.
- If you currently hold a supervisory position within an organization, these hours can be used in place of an internship.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

- It is recommended that you complete your work hours the semester before you enroll in the course.



ACCEPTABLE DOCUMENTATION

- Copy of pay stubs showing hours worked.
- Copy of letter from your employer indicating position held, dates and total number of hours worked. You **MUST** include your employer's contact information.
- The employer must send the form directly to the instructor of record and cannot come from the student.
