Located at campuses in Sugar Land, Katy, and Houston, the Gessner College of Nursing establishes educational partnerships with both rural and urban health care facilities. Approved undergraduate programs of study include the Traditional Track BSN, RN to BSN track, and Second Degree BSN track.

TRADITIONAL BSN TRACK

This track is for the University of Houston student interested in nursing. The primary educational objective of the <u>Traditional BSN Track</u> is to produce graduates for professional nursing practice who can draw upon knowledge from biological sciences, social sciences, humanities, and nursing to critically analyze human responses to actual and potential health problems and provide appropriate nursing interventions.

Requirements for all candidates pursuing the Traditional BSN degree are listed in the <u>UH Catalog</u> under Gessner College of Nursing and on the Gessner <u>College of Nursing</u> <u>Traditional BSN Track web page</u>.

Pre-nursing students must apply and be accepted to the Gessner College of Nursing BSN major to be considered a nursing student.

RN TO BSN TRACK

This track is for the registered nurse with an associate's degree or diploma in nursing. The primary educational objective of the RN to BSN Track is to increase career and educational opportunities available to registered nurses in the University's service region. Graduates of the program will have a broader understanding of the nursing profession and will bring that understanding to the practice of nursing in their places of employment. Graduates will be prepared to assume some leadership and management roles.

SECOND DEGREE BSN TRACK

The primary objective of the <u>Second Degree BSN Track</u> is to produce graduates for professional nursing practice who can draw upon knowledge from the biological sciences, social sciences, humanities and nursing to critically analyze human responses to actual and potential health problems and provide appropriate nursing interventions.

The Second Degree bachelors program is a twelve-month intensive full-time program for people holding bachelors or masters degrees in other fields who want to become registered nurses (RNs). This program is designed to facilitate a career change for the more mature and experienced student.
